



Thank you for purchasing our Potion Party Pack! Inside, you'll find magical supplies to help create a fun and enchanting potion-making party.

Here are some additional tips & tricks to make your potion party one that kids will remember!

Things you may want to include:

- Bowls & trays to display potion ingredients
- Bottles for liquids (Dollar stores & Thrift stores!)
- Spoons, stir sticks, and popsicle sticks for stirring
- Potion bowls for kids (Empty jars & mason jars work great!)
- Gather outside nature supplies for more fun!

Depending on the size of your table, you may want to spread your potion ingredients out in a few different spots so everyone can reach them easily. Try visiting local thrift stores & dollar stores to find unique bowls, jars, & fun containers to create a magical potion-making table!

Potion Powders & Magic Fizzing Mix:

Start with 1 or 2 scoops of the Magic Potion Powder in a bowl, and add small amounts of water at a time. You don't need a lot of Magic Potion Powder to make a shimmering potion. Encourage kids to move slowly with the ingredients; this helps ensure they are creating magical brews while making the ingredients last longer. Provide water on the table for kids to mix their potions. To keep the magic going, sprinkle small amounts of the Magic Fizzing Mix (if included) into the potions. But, be careful, a little bit goes a long way! When adding glitter or dried flowers (if included), I also recommend small amounts at a time. Holographic glitter can overpower a potion if too much is used.

TIP: I recommend placing small amounts of each potion ingredient in several spots around the table so they last longer, rather than putting everything in one large bowl. Adding trays under the potion bowls will help catch spills and avoid messes.

Liquid Elixir Powders:

Simply mix the powder (1/2tsp) into a pitcher or jar and add up to 32oz of water.

TIP: The more water you add, the less shimmery the elixir will be. There is no wrong way to make magic, so experiment by starting slowly with the water to achieve the perfect shimmering glow! Set out on the table for kids to add to their potions or store in beautiful bottles or jars for keepsakes!

Stirring Tools:

These can be spoons, popsicle sticks, or similar things that help kids mix up their potions. Fizzing powders and the salts included in the mixes can irritate open cuts or scrapes. I do not recommend mixing by hand.

Pipettes:

Kids can use the pipettes to transfer their potions into jars or test tubes (if included).

Jars, Potion Bottles, Pitchers:

Look around the house for any glass jars you can use to store or mix your potions in. Head to the local thrift store for bowls, jars, and other unique finds to decorate your potion table with! Mix and match funky finds to make your table fun and whimsical! If you want, simple, disposable dishes work just as well!
